TransParenting Seminar


Four-hour seminars provided by licensed therapist Peter Debbink are held at Church Health Services, 115 North Center St., Beaver Dam, WI



The parents are given a handbook that guides them through identifying their feelings and conflict pressure points in their relationship with the other parent.



The focus of the TransParenting Seminar is to help parents provide a nurturing, non-threatening environment for children during and after divorce or break-up. The seminar is four hours. The seminar helps parents understand the impact their breakup has on their children.



One-on-One Mentor

The one-on-one mentors are volunteers who are provided training by Shelby Brandsma, the Dodge County Director of Family Court Counseling Services. The mentors are assigned to families who request the one-onone assistance. Mentors provide telephone assistance and can make visits to the home. if required. Mentors may also volunteer to supervise visits for the family, if supervised visits are ordered by the Court.
