Using the Rotary Marks

The Rotary emblem identifies Rotary clubs and their members in every part of the world. All Rotarians should be concerned with protecting the integrity of the emblem and ensuring it is available for future Rotary clubs and districts to use.

Rotary International owns trademarks and service marks (referred to as Rotary Marks) for the benefit of Rotarians worldwide.

Rotary Marks Guidelines

Naming Guidelines

When the “Rotary” name, emblem, or other Rotary Marks appear with the name of a club project, program, website, or publication, make sure that the name is placed near the emblem and given equal prominence. Proper naming examples include:

- Valley Rotary Club Cleanup Project
- Centennial Park of the Rotary Club of Mountain City
- www.anycityrotaryclub.org

For specific guidelines on using the Rotary name and emblem, see Rotary Code of Policies 33.020.7 or contact your Club and District Support representative.

Reproducing the Rotary Emblem

When reproducing the Rotary emblem, follow the guidelines approved by the RI Board of Directors that allow a Rotary club, district, and other Rotary Entity* to use the Rotary Marks:

- The Rotary emblem may not be altered, modified, or obstructed in any way. It must be reproduced in its complete form.



The most common problem when reproducing the Rotary emblem is not using it in its entirety. Avoid the following improper uses of the Rotary emblem:

- The keyway is missing from the center.



- The center of the emblem is filled in.



- The emblem is partially covered or modified.

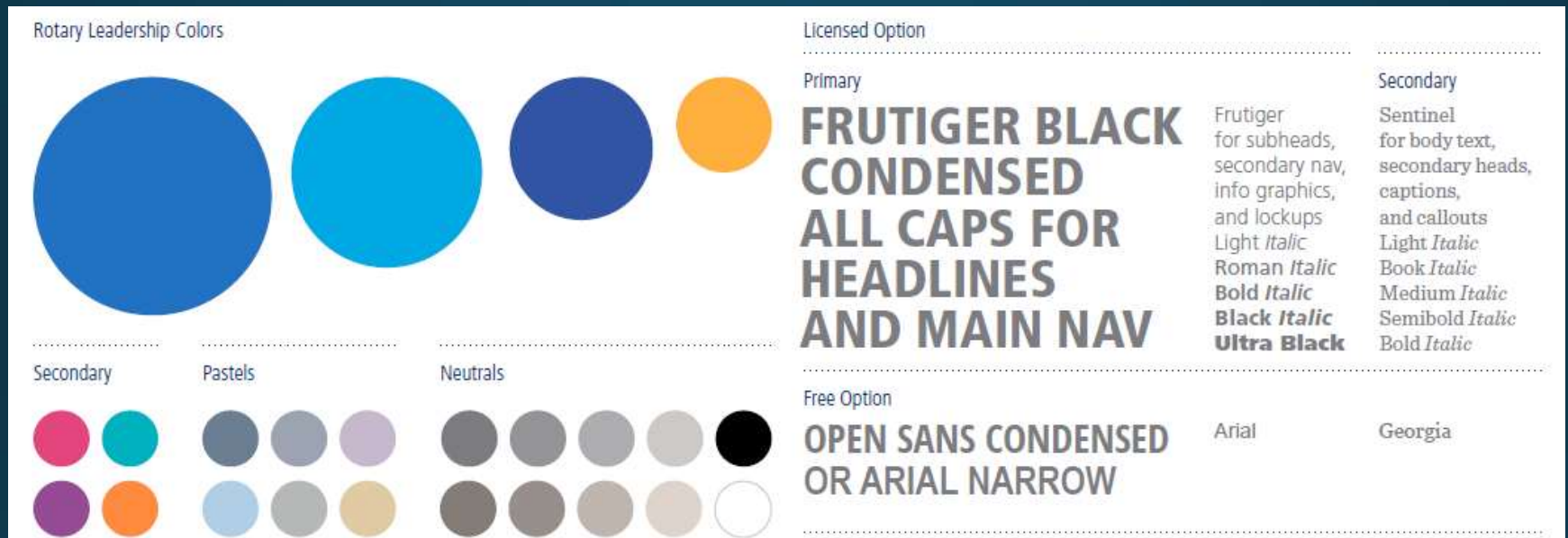

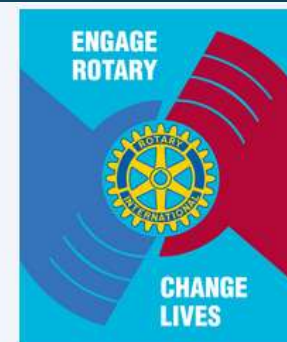


