District Grants

Edgerton - Purchase and install the fieldstone pavers in the vessel plaza to create an urban garden which will create community comradery as the project will be built by local volunteers - \$5000

La Crosse - Cameroon Health and Technology Project - Provide the needed technology to set up a hospital patient information system - \$5000

Madison WTM - Santa Maria de Jesus Orphanage - Build a solar water heating system composed of 12 panels, 2 holding tanks, and 2 re-circulating pumps along with security components. - \$5000

Menominee - Study, train, and prepare adult students for their GED and assist them with the changes that have taken place for the 2014 GED requirements. - \$2250

Onalaska Hilltoppers - Movie Creation to prevent teenage drinking and driving and teach teens to take responsibilities for their actions. - \$5000

12 Grants = \$55,000+

Global Grants

Madison After Hours - THE CHAELI CAMPAIGN - The Chaeli Campaign will: promote and provide for the mobility and educational needs of disabled children under the age of eighteen years, throughout South Africa. The aim is to provide a solid and effective early childhood development foundation, thus enabling transition to mainstream schooling where appropriate. - \$5000

Holmen - We wish to provide clean, safe water, as well as sanitary facilities to the people of San Miguel de Tangarara in northern Peru. The project will also include hygiene education and empowerment in the form of a public utility to create sustainability by funding future operation and maintenance expenses. - \$17976

Tomah - The objective of this grant is to promote peace through a sustainable project to provide clean water, education and economic opportunities to 14 communities near Busolo, Uganda. We have successfully partnered in the past with Rotarians and community leaders to build a profitable chicken farm that supports the educational needs in these subsistence farming communities. \$86229(Grant App Still in progress)
